DYSLEXIA INITIATIVE PILOT PROGRAM IS UNDERWAY IN THE PARK CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT

PCSD's Dyslexia Initiative is the result of the collaboration among PCSD teachers & administrators, the Ty and Karen Hall Foundation, PC READS and the Park City Education Foundation. Our vision is to ensure that our teachers are empowered with instructional tools and insights to assist any student struggling with reading. The goals of the initiative are to provide effective reading instruction for all students, increase awareness of the reading impediments dyslexic students encounter and to better ensure all struggling readers are identified early and receive appropriate interventions.

Three main components of the Dyslexia Initiative's first year are:

- (1) McPolin Elementary School is piloting the Wilson Fundations program in grades K-2. This is a research-based program, using a systematic approach to teaching foundational skills with multisensory strategies.
- (2) A representative from each PCSD elementary school will attend an intensive Orton-Gillingham training in December. These representative will begin infusing their learning and awareness of multi-sensory strategies into their school's professional learning.
- (3) PC READS will offer a dyslexia awareness presentation for elementary teachers.

Park City Education Foundation will be assessing the pilot at McPolin by focusing on the fidelity of implementation and impact on student achievement. We know that a successful execution of the implementation matters in order to support future rollout in the other schools.
