Join Hubbell, dyslexic superstars Billy Bob Thornton and Joe Pantoliano, world-renowned brain scientists and researchers, students and advocates as they join a movement to revolutionize education. Find out what it's like to have your brain scanned inside an fMRI and visit with a group of dyslexic researchers in the jungles of Costa Rica, all the while following Hubbell through his days of growing up dyslexic before many had even heard of the word. Through the nonlinear brain of Hubbell, his lens captures the otherwise complex issues of learning differences in a manner that allows the audience to recognize the differences and honor the gifts in all of us. We will host two panels: A panel of experts in dyslexia, education and legislation; and a panel of dyslexic students, experts themselves, to describe what it is like to navigate our current educational system.

There will be time to ask questions of both panels.

On September 16th we hosted "Building a Collaborative Relationship with your School"

Great information was shared by our guests from the Utah State Office of Education (USOE). The process of obtaining an IEP plan was reviewed, as were many acronyms. In addition to understanding the evaluation process, it's important to understand that there are 13 disability categories under IDEA and dyslexia falls under the "SLD" category. Park City is using the "combined method" to determine eligibility, which means that they look at both RTI efforts and the discrepancy between achievement and intellectual ability. The use of RTI cannot delay or deny a parents request for a special education evaluation. The USOE also offers Parent Advocates. Section 504 was also reviewed. A good resource for 504 information from USOE is: A Parent Guide to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.
